NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on February 11, 1985 the Alhambra City Council adopted Ordinance No. 085-3973 which amended the Alhambra Municipal Code pertaining to the terms of office for the various Boards and Commission members. Each member is now appointed for a one-year period with the term expiring at 12:01 a.m. on the **date of the second regular Council Meeting in March of each year**; i.e., March 24, 2003. Each member may be reappointed, but may not serve more than eight consecutive yearly terms **excepting** the Youth Commission to which each member may be reappointed, but may not serve more than six consecutive yearly terms.

Copies of rosters of the above Boards and Commissions are on file in the City Clerk's Office and are hereby incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof as though fully set forth herein, and are available to the public at no cost in the City Clerk's Office. As the need arises, other advisory groups are established by the City Council to perform a specific service.

QUALIFICATIONS: In order to be eligible to serve as a member on any of the above Boards and Commissions, the applicant must be a **resident and registered voter of the City of Alhambra; excepting** the HCDA Citizen Advisory Committee, the Design Review Board and the Youth Commission, the qualifications for which are as follows:

HCDA Citizen Advisory Committee: In order to be eligible for appointment, an applicant must be either a resident of the City or a member of its business community and representative of one or more of the following groups of persons: Low- and moderate-income minority, resident of an area where a significant amount of activity is proposed or ongoing, elderly, handicapped, the business community, and/or member of a civic group which is concerned about the program.

Design Review Board: In addition to being a resident and registered voter of the City of Alhambra, an applicant must have experience in one of the design professions; such as, architecture, construction, interior design, city planning or landscape architecture.

Youth Commission: In order to be eligible for appointment, an applicant must either be a resident of or attend a school within the City of Alhambra and be between the ages of 14 and 20 years.
